The Transfiguration Community Thrift Shop Grand Opening will be on April 10 at 4 PM as it begins its service to the Colesville Community and the surrounding area.

Three of our members have formed the directorate of the Thrift Shop: John Porter, Ruby Bracket, and Val Grant.

As of March 27, 250 volunteer hours have already been logged in get-

ting the shop ready for customers. Nathanael Porter has given 4 hours, Timothy Porter 6 hours, Ruby Bracket 25 hours, Val Grant 30 hours, and John Porter 185 hours. We thank these volunteers for their work, and we are looking for additional volunteers as the TCTS gets up and running.

We are very excited about this new ministry. We are hoping that with

our geographical proximity to C-4, both organizations will benefit from those who are seeking to find what they need. Our plan is to help provide for the C-4 by either sharing those things donated or by sending them on to C-4 after a set period of shelf life. This will help our products turn over and help C-4 acquire additional products.
